



Dress Guidelines

Members are requested not only to adhere to the dress guidelines themselves but also to ensure the dress of other members/guests on the course and in the clubhouse complies with the set standards.

Individuals must be smartly dressed both on and off the course.

On the Course	In the Clubhouse
Golf Shoes must be worn.	Minimum dress code is to be smart casual at all times.
Shirts must have collars and be tucked in unless designed to be worn outside trousers.	Soft spike golf shoes are permitted in the bar.
Tailored shorts and trousers only, sitting no lower than the waist.	Footwear must be worn at all times
No combat style shorts or trousers or beachwear	Tailored shirts may be worn outside trousers.
	Hats and visors must be removed when entering the clubhouse.
No denim, tracksuits, or vests. No football or baseball style shirts.	Tracksuits and vests are not acceptable at any time. Football and baseball style shirts are also not allowed.
Socks of predominantly one colour (not bright colours) must be worn when wearing shorts.	Combat shorts or trousers are not permitted.
	Smart denim (i.e. no slits or holes) is permitted in the clubhouse.
	Open toed sandals are permitted without socks but plastic flip flops are not permitted in the Clubhouse.
Please Note:	Please Note:
Changing clothes in the car park is not allowed, but shoes may be changed.	Mobile phones are to be on silent in the Clubhouse. Owners of phones ringing in the clubhouse will be asked to turn their ring tones off and make a donation to the Captain's charity
Golfers must not share clubs or bags	The dress and behaviour of young children is the responsibility of their parents.
Mobile phones to be on silent or vibrate	

Failure to adhere to the dress code on the course may result in you being asked to leave the course unless the infringement is rectified and in the clubhouse you will not be served at the bar and may be asked to leave.
